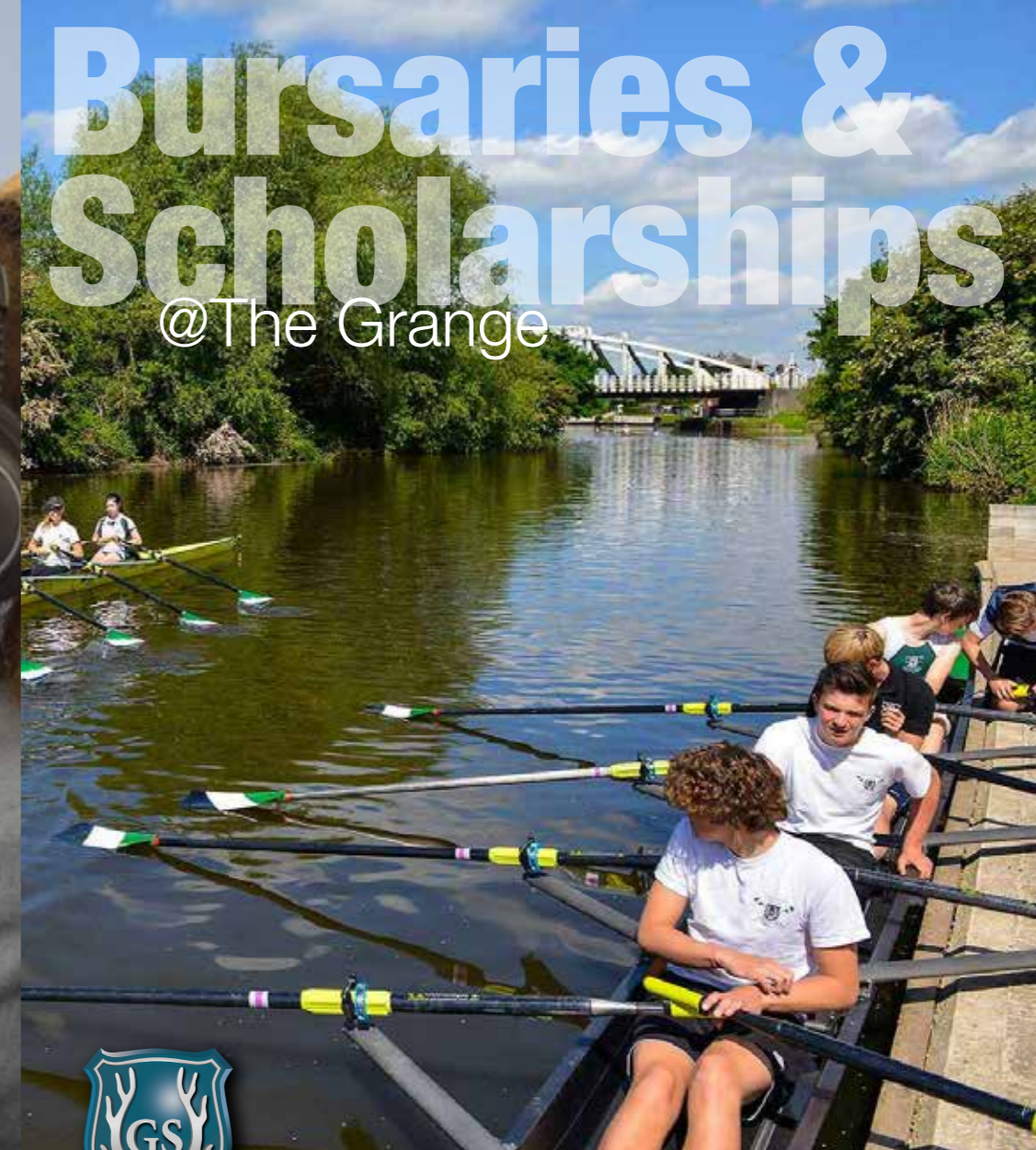

Bursaries & Scholarships

@The Grange

The Grange Senior School provides a number of bursaries (reduced fees) each year for pupils applying for admission into Year 7 and Year 12 (Sixth Form). The Access to Excellence Bursary developed for Year 7 pupils is intended to make a Grange education more accessible and may cover up to 100% of school fees. All bursaries are means-tested and are based on parental income and assets. They are reviewed annually in light of changes in parental circumstances. A strong academic performance in the Year 7 Entrance Examination is required as well as evidence of high academic potential or achievement in GCSE results for Year 12 entry. A bursary can stand alone or supplement Scholarships.

Year 7 Bursaries

Detailed financial information is required by Friday 8th December 2017. All information is kept strictly confidential. The bursary will be awarded in February, for entry into school the following September and is tenable throughout the pupil's time at the Senior School subject to good conduct and progress.

Year 12 Bursaries

Bursaries are available for external students entering Sixth Form. All applicants will need to provide financial information Friday 23rd March 2018. All information is kept strictly confidential. Each award is tenable for the two years of Sixth Form, subject to good conduct and progress.

Academic Scholarship

Academic Scholarships are awarded annually at 11+ based on the results of the Entrance Assessment with successful candidates benefitting from 20% remission on school fees.



Sixth Form Scholarship

The Sixth Form Scholarship is an honorary award, awarded to internal or external students each year and is dependent upon their:

- Performance in the Sixth Form Scholarship Examination
- Performance at GCSE
- Overall character, behaviour and attitude towards their studies



The award carries a high degree of academic credibility with successful scholars receiving public recognition including their names being added to a Scholarship presentation board in our Sixth Form Centre. Scholars will also be entitled and expected to contribute to the following:

- Presentation of their Scholarship Award at Prize Giving at the start of the Lower Sixth. The award will be a two-year subscription to an academic journal or e-journal of their choice;
- Leadership Training at the start of the Lower Sixth to allow them to support the Upper Sixth Senior Prefects by undertaking certain duties;
- Attending certain public events as ambassadors of the School and providing tours to visitors;
- Supporting students in Years 8 and 9 with the Head's Award;
- Inclusion of the Scholarship in their UCAS reference.

Applications need to be received by Friday 9th March 2018

Music Scholarship

One music scholarship will be offered annually to a pupil entering Year 7. The scholarship is worth a reduction in school fees of up to 20% as well as free tuition in one instrument or voice at school by a member of our peripatetic team. The award is tenable for the first five years of the Senior School and it is possible to extend the scholarship into the Sixth Form where Music is chosen as an A level subject.

The contribution of the Music Scholar is reviewed annually with the Director of Music and the school reserves the right to terminate a scholarship after discussion with the parents if it is felt that the pupil is not sufficiently committed to the musical life of the school.

You should be able to play two instruments, or play one instrument and sing and be Grade 4 standard on at least one of your instruments or in singing.

At the audition you will be asked to undertake the following:

- * Perform a piece of music of your own choice on each of your two instruments or on one instrument and voice. An accompanist will be provided where necessary, or you may bring your own with you if preferred. You should notify the school in advance if an accompanist will be required
- * Perform a Sight-Reading test of a standard that reflects your musical experiences
- * Answer some Aural tests of a standard that reflects your musical experiences
- * Discuss your musical interests and achievements.

The Music Scholarship audition will take place on Friday 19th January 2018. The offer of a Music Scholarship is dependent upon the candidate's performance in the entrance assessment.
